
# SECTION THREE: 5 Disciples







5 DISCIPLES: The world is made up of 5 different types of people (a.k.a. "disciples").
Spiritually speaking, everyone fits somewhere in this biblical & progressive blueprint... Are you amongst the Lost, Lovers, Learners, Leaders, or Lifers?



# The LEADER

A <u>stable</u>, born again, <u>spiritual-adult</u>; a disciple whose DNA & discipleship (both inward & outward) are producing a <u>pattern</u> of missional, Christ-like, servant-oriented, multiplying-fruit, in the context of <u>faithfully following the Lord Jesus Christ...</u>

Leaders are fishers of men; spiritual pillars, <u>koinonia-championing</u> chaperones; &/or spiritual "parents" in the family of God.

# 2 Timothy 3:16-17

# INTRO:

Welcome back to Section Three, where we are continuing to discuss the "5 Disciples." Herein we will show where and how Christianity can give an account for EVERY human being... past, present, and future. In other words, Christianity has a valid designation and description for every person, everywhere, throughout all human history. No exceptions. Zero! Moreover, our "Framework" diagram (also known as the "LIFE Cycle" in earlier training materials) offers a user-friendly, visual, and comprehensive tool that aids in the spiritually-defining and missional-placement of each individual on earth. EVERY single person. Bar none.

Having said that, being able to define and describe all of humanity is both valuable and validating for any professing worldview. In the case of Christianity, our worldview is unique, in part, to the extent that we recognize the reality and relationship that exists between the 5 types of disciples who make up the world's population.

At the risk of overstating the obvious, take note, without a cohesive comprehension of how the people of the world relate to one another, at the core of their humanness, it would be hard to advance, with any viable seriousness, a credible worldview. Fortunately, the God of the Bible has been more than forthright when it comes to engaging and explaining the human condition from birth to burial, from the Garden of Eden to each soul's eternal destination.

Finally, before we begin, just to be clear, let us briefly review Section One ("1 DESIGN"), Section Two ("3 DIVISIONS" – HEAD, HEART, and HANDS), and how they have begun the "FLOW," which now cascades down to Section Three and the "5 DISCIPLES."

Seeing the holistic connection between Come And See Christianity's FLOW sections is critical for one's long-term understanding of the definitions and dynamics that make up a biblical worldview AND Christian discipleship. Stated differently, God's one divine design calls for the sharing of THE Gospel, per God's Word, will, and ways (a.k.a. a biblical worldview). At the same time, the missional "design" of Almighty God calls for the miraculous transformation of each person's three core "divisions" – their HEAD, their HEART, and their HANDS. Now we are ready to address humanity in whole.

# PRAYER:

# **CONTEXT:**

## Macro

In our previous lesson, we looked at the third type of the world's five disciples... the LEARNER. By definition, in that study, we realized that God's design calls for all Christians to grow and BE sanctified.

As we begin to focus on the LEADER, it is important to note that everything which defines and describes the LOVER and LEARNER remains in the LEADER. To that end, developing into greater Christ-likeness is the key difference and dynamic at all transitional stages. Consider, in the same way that a baby changes and grows into a teenager, so it is with the baby LOVER who grows into a spiritual adolescent (also known as the LEARNER). Similarly, LEADERS are born when LEARNERS "graduate" and move into their higher privileges and responsibilities. Notice that the growth process, in both the physical AND spiritual examples, can be quite dramatic and very noticeable, while never altering the person's DNA.

Next, it is absolutely essential that the Holy Bible, God's inspired and inerrant (without error) Scriptures, be used, in full context, to define and describe ALL aspects and dynamics that prove to be relevant to our topic. In short, God's Word is both the Almighty's absolute AND authoritative truth. In our study and in our lives, if God said it, that settles it!

Finally... it is important to recognize that any thorough attempt to explain what Christianity means by "saved" must, at the very least, expand upon and explain some foundational, biblical, spiritual, personal, and eternal relationships. For example, there is a need to understand the relationship between Creator God and created man (John 1:1-18); between the Savior of souls and the enemy (1 Peter 5:8) of souls; between the Word of God and the opinions of the world... All of these and more have a part to play when it comes to understanding the cause, affect, grace, and blessings of the LEADER.

## NOTE:

When we speak of the four (4) "saved" types of disciples (LOVER, LEARNER, LEADER, & LIFER) in a collective, historical, and global sense; together (in contrast to the LOST), they make up the biblical Christian Church (capital "C" intended). Herein, you will find true and authentic (while still sinful and imperfect) Christianity.

## Micro

While the Bible speaks of the capital "C" Church in an "all-Christians" everywhere context, make no mistake, the global-macro family portrait of Christianity is nothing more than a culmination of all the micro, individual, and personal Christians being pooled together as the Church. In other words, biblically speaking, being a LEADER (a.k.a. a "stable, mature, and fruit producing adult" Christian) is a very personal and, by God's grace, eternal condition. Amen! Consequently, Christ's best ambassadors personally Engage, Explain, Equip, Empower, and Exemplify Christlikeness when discipling LEADERS (and/or discipling as LEADERS)... always hoping to grow in, while simultaneously helping to share with others, Christianity's "gospel" (a.k.a. "good news").

At this point, we would be well served to revisit our "Framework" diagram, which divides all of humanity into 5 specific types of DISCIPLES: the LOST, the LOVER, the LEARNER, the LEADER, and the LIFER. Remember, from our introduction to Section Three, every human being belongs, at any given point in their lives, in ONE of these five DISCIPLE groups, at any given time. Moreover, each person's positioning is based on their <u>current</u> spiritual relationship to Creator Christ and all that His cross represents.

To be clear... in saying (above) that, "each person's positioning is based on their *current*, spiritual relationship to Creator Christ and all that His cross represents," there are three biblical truths that should be undergirded.

- 1. "Current" implies that changes can occur... because they can and they should. In short, God's divine design calls for spiritual growth.
- 2. Having said that, also note that the spiritual path between the LOST and LOVER only goes one way. The good news is that the "current" LOST can become, by God's grace, a future "LOVER" (Ephesians 2:1-10). The even better news is that <u>it is impossible for a born-again LOVER to lose their salvation and go back to being LOST</u> (cf. John 5:24) Amen!
- 3. Finally, the word "current" underscores that we are highlighting and explaining the broad, 5 step, potentially dynamic process of spiritual growth that Christianity reveals. Moreover, in the same way that one can review a physical life from pre-birth, to infancy, to adolescence, to adulthood, to senior citizenship, so it is spiritually when we describe the LOST, the LOVER, the LEARNER, the LEADER, and the LIFER.

# 1. The LEADER's VALIDATION

Illustration:

In the early days of our church, shortly after we had begun inviting the public to join our worship services (in the local elementary school cafeteria which served as our sanctuary) a self-described "prominent" woman in our community came to me and offered two things: 1). a copy of her book on Christian ministry; and 2). the "blessing of her leading our women's ministry." With a somewhat high-brow, puffed up posture, this woman wanted me to recognize just how gracious she was being with her offer, and how blessed our church would be if her leadership were to be grafted into our ministry.

My immediate response included a cordial, "Thank you, but what we really need is some help with the servant's work of setting up and tearing down the school each week." Thinking that I must not have heard or understood her offer, the woman ignored my response and sharply restated her original offer. With an uncomfortably awkward pause and literal replay, I restated my response... to which the woman did not respond. She simply turned at that point and walked out of the school cafeteria.

One might think the story ends there... but it did not. That night I read the woman's book from cover to cover. Further, I highlighted the entire book with two different colors. Everything (in both colors) that I highlighted was good, sound teaching or encouragement. While much of the book was worthy of reading and helpful, I found the content to be divided into two categories (and now two colors): 1). truths with which I had no cause for questioning; and 2). truths that were solid theologically, BUT, at the same time, truths that her behavior betrayed the day before in our conversation.

Next, the following day, I went to where the woman told me she worked. With her book in my hand, I asked if we could talk in a public but semi-private setting. Before I could say any more, she exclaimed, "Oh! I see you have my book with you... I'm glad to see that you changed your mind and that you have come to take me up on my offer." In another awkward moment, I said, "No. Thank you again for your offer, but that is not why I have come." To which she replied, "Oh... Well, then I guess you have come because you want me to sign my book for you." Again, an awkward pause... followed by, "Thank you. But that is not why I have come. Can we talk about your book in a different setting?" Sadly, there were people beginning to gather around as she sought to make sure that everyone could hear our exchange, for reasons that she assumed would make much of herself.

Seeing my obvious discomfort with our setting, she insisted, "Anything that you want to say or ask of me about my book can be said in front of these people." Before I could get out another request for a change of scenery, she forcefully restated, just as she had done the day before, what she had just said. At that point, I told her that I had read and highlighted, with two distinct colors and purposes, her entire book the night before. She looked at the book as I flipped through the pages. At that point she proudly gloated, "There is a lot of highlighting in there. You must have liked what you read." I replied, "Yes. I think that everything I highlighted is excellent." She then asked about the two colors... I told her that one of the two colors represented my reason for coming and wanting to talk. Understandably, she assumed that I must have had comprehension or application questions with a significant portion of her work.

Here comes our QUALIFICATION lesson for LEADERS...

I again had to say, "No. Unfortunately, that is not why I came to talk. Instead, I want to discuss the contrast between what you wrote in your book (as detailed with this certain color of highlighting) and what you did and displayed yesterday in our conversation – to include your ignoring of my response and request for help in serving." In near shock, she exclaimed, "Hang on! Let me get this straight. You are calling me a hypocrite... You are asking me why I did not do what I wrote?!?" I affirmed, "Yes. Exactly." At that point, our discussion came to a screeching halt as she roared: "This meeting is OVER!" and walked out.

# Application:

In one sense, every true Christian is a spiritual leader. To the extent that they can lead others to Christ by sharing their personal testimony and The Gospel which saved their soul, they are a light and leader in a dark and lost world.

At the same time, the LEADER in our Come And See Christianity discipleship materials is a bit different. Here, the LEADER is a structural understanding that is based on one's advanced spiritual maturity. Consequently, it is important to measure and assess all potential, acting, and/or professing LEADERS by one standard, their learning, loving, and living of God's Word, will, and ways.

Be blessed in knowing that consistent and stable, biblical Christlikeness, NOT a churchy resume, is the real and righteous QUALIFICATION for biblical LEADERS... no more and no less.

# 2. The LEADER'S MATURATION

Illustration:

According to Scripture, virtually everything that truly qualifies a person for leadership is directly related to character.



# Explanation:

Biblical LEADERS are those true Christians who have grown, by God grace and for His glory, through the LOVER and LEARNER stages of spiritual development. Like all followers of Christ, they are far from perfect. Instead, what differentiates them from the LEARNER is their capacity and desire to serve and multiply. Moreover, the LEADER recognizes and attributes their talents, abilities, giftedness, and fruit to the grace and providential workings of Almighty God in them... and through them.

The LEADER's maturing and stable HEAD, HEART, and HANDS can be seen, subtly but importantly, in the FRAMEWORK diagram... To that point, note that the LEADER is placed to the right of the LOST, LOVER, and LEARNER (representing spiritual development). At the same time, notice that unlike the LOST, LOVER, and LEARNER, the LEADER's trajectory is NOT going up. Rather, there is a horizontal, "pouring out" posture with the LEADER. Stated differently, the healthy spiritual LEADER realizes that like Christ, they are "not to be served, but to serve and give their lives as a ransom for many" (Matthew 20:28).

When we see the Discipleship Contextualization diagram alongside the LEADER's placement in the FRAMEWORK graphic, the holistic nature of spiritual growth begins to make more sense and visually harmonize.

# Explanation:

True and healthy Christlike Christian leadership is marked by a number of virtues. One of the most endearing and impactful aspects of the LEADER's character is the commitment levels that he or she consistently upholds. By divine design, the dedication and devotion that LEADERS display in their learning, loving, and living are used by God to inform, inspect, and inspire others.

To that end, through the Holy Spirit's empowerment (Acts 1:8) and the abiding grace of the Lord Jesus Christ (John 15:4), LEADERS, like good shepherds, courageously serve and sacrifice for their sheep... no matter what! By contrast, selfish "hirelings" tend to have their heartless cowardice exposed when they cut and run in the face of danger and discomfort (John 10:11-12).

LEADERS, a category of mature and missional disciples who come from all walks of life, are like Ananias from Acts 9... They are imperfect yet passionate disciples whose love and devotion lead them to say, "Yes, LORD!" when others tend to grumble and whine, "Why, LORD?"
