






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SECTION FOUR: 7 Details








7 DETAILS: The <u>divine</u> is in the details... Here we have what we also call The Fundamentals, that which explains the core & comprehensive truths of Christianity, as well as a <u>biblical worldview</u>.

The FUNDAMENTALS

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We have described the 7
"details" as 7 "Fundamentals,"
each one beginning with
the letter "F" ...to help you
to remember them:-)
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The Family

The FAMILY:

God's family is to <u>live</u> in beautiful and convicting contrast to culture...

We LOVE UP, IN, & OUT, while exemplifying Christ-like, selfless service, all while living in <u>supernatural unity</u>.

2 Timothy 3:16-17

All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for rebuking, for correction, and for training in righteousness, <u>17</u>so that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work.

INTRO:

Welcome to Come And See Christianity's section four, "The DETAILS." At this point, we have already established in sections 1-3 that Almighty God has "1 Divine DESIGN" (found in His authentic biblical worldview) for all of creation. Next, we addressed the fact that every human being is made up of "3 DIVISIONS," their HEAD, HEART, and HANDS (also known as their beliefs, their beloved, and their behaviors). From there, we moved on to the "5 DISCIPLES," the LOST, LOVERS, LEARNERS, LEADERS, and LIFERS, which proved that Christianity accounts for, with definitions and descriptions, ALL people... past, present, and future, from ALL parts of the world – bar none.

With our Creator and all His image-bearing (Genesis 1:27) creatures accounted for, the next logical step on the narrow path of understanding will concentrate on the sure-footedness of core, non-negotiable, and eternally essential content. In short, we need to know what we need to know.

To that end, The DETAILS will define and describe, in a broad and biblical context, (7) seven progressive principles of God's truth in love (Ephesians 4:15) that serve to engage, explain, equip, empower, and exemplify the fundamentals of Christianity. Herein, we will unveil and unpack a comprehensive summary and cohesive overview of God's biblical blueprint for understanding His created reality. Having said that, in moving forward, to help paint the fuller portrait of genuine Christianity, each DETAIL will receive its own lesson. Herein, we will focus on #6, **The FAMILY.**

CONTEXT:

Macro

When it comes to learning about Christ, Christianity, and the biblical Church, relatively speaking, a thousand lifetimes filled with devoted study would not dig through the endless depths of God's divine grace, gospel, and glory. Frankly (and thankfully), the fullness of Creator Christ is far beyond our ability to <u>fully</u> comprehend. To quote Him directly and prove the point, hear Almighty God, "Where were you when I laid the earth's foundations?" (Job 38:4). In short, we need to maintain a sense of genuine awe and reverent fear (1 Peter 1:17) when it comes to loving and learning about the LORD.

At the same time, the character, commands, and commissioning of the living God, Christianity's Christ and King, compels us to draw near to Him (James 4:8) with the promise that He will draw near to us. Moreover, the God of the Bible promises that He has miraculously given all true Christians "everything needed for life and godliness" (2 Peter 1:3), which includes an anointed understanding of His Word, will, and ways (1 Corinthians 2:14).

NOTE: the unification and blessed tension of the two paragraphs above can be harmonized when one realizes how these truths complement each other. On one hand, there are (7) fundamental details that share a progressive and straight-forward, principle-based explanation of Christianity. And, at the same time, all (7) have a divine depth and truth-filled treasure that is both bottomless and priceless – Amen!

Ouch! That is a tough quote to lead into a lesson on God's FAMILY... True. But then again, "truth in love" (Ephesians 4:15) calls for loving truth to be told – no matter what. Moreover, when it comes to God's FAMILY, it is time to stop rationalizing and justifying the "fun" in the FAMILY's disfunction. Instead, Christ's professing church needs a check-up, an internal inspection, a biblical building Inspector to walk through the hallways of our HEADs, HEARTs, and HANDs, checking to see whether or not we are actually, individually, and collectively "building to code."

At the risk of breaking stride and altering expectations, it is important to highlight, right from the start, that God's Word, will, and ways are under attack when it comes to defining and describing authentic Christianity, biblical Church, and the FAMILY of God. Consequently, our lesson, like those prior, will continue to build upon the previous DETAILS/FUNDAMENTALS. To be clear, when it comes to The FAMILY of God, we will be talking about the human fruit of The FAITH/Gospel and the grace-based, blood-bought victors in The FIGHT (also known as spiritual warfare). Herein, there will be three primary pillars (Loving UP, Loving IN, and Loving OUT) that will serve as our outline, with four additional components supporting the core. In total, there are (7) traits that encompass and exemplify God's faith FAMILY.

Christianity's 7 FAMILY Traits

1. **Loving UP:** A miraculous, grace-gifted, biblical love & awe for God

2. **Loving IN:** Koinonia: a supernaturally unified love for God's family

3. **Loving OUT:** Harmonizing the Great Commandments & Commission

4. **Loving ALL**: A foundational heart posture for living Christ-likeness

5. **Serving:** A loving, sacrificial, others-oriented, hands-on humility

6. **Christ-likeness:** The defining ideal for every Christian and every church

7. **Culture:** Normalizing intentional support for all Christ-likeness

1. LOVE UP

Illustration:

God's merciful love & miraculous grace + our repentance & biblical faith = **UP love!**

Explanation:

Some contemporary churches are billed as "<u>seeker-friendly</u>" but the Bible says that "no one seeks God." <u>Psalm 14:2–3</u> pictures God searching in vain for even one heart that seeks Him: "The Lord looks down from heaven on all mankind to see if there are any who understand, any who seek God. All have turned away, all have become corrupt; there is no one who does good, not even one." This passage is quoted in <u>Romans 3:10–12</u>, which says, "As it is written: 'There is no one righteous, not even one; there is no one who understands; there is no one who seeks God." So, if no one seeks God, who are the "seekers" that some churches strategize to attract? Plus, how are people saved if no one is seeking God?

First, we must understand human nature. Because of Adam's disobedience in the Garden of Eden (Genesis 3:11), sin entered the world and became part of human existence. Because Adam is the common ancestor of every human being, we all inherit that sin nature. We are born with a natural desire for rebellion, self-interest, and disobedience. In Romans 7:18, Paul says, "For I know that good itself does not dwell in me, that is, in my sinful nature. For I have the desire to do what is good, but I cannot carry it out." In ourselves, we cannot seek after God, for the simple reason that seeking God is a good and holy thing. Sinful flesh is incapable of good and holy things (Isaiah 64:6).

Jesus said, "No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws them" (John 6:44). In other words, the only way we can seek God is if the Holy Spirit has first stirred our hearts with a desire for God. It is God who draws us to Himself. Ephesians 2:8 underscores this truth: "By grace are you saved, through faith, and that not of yourselves. It is the gift of God." Even the faith to believe for salvation does not originate within our fleshly nature. God enables the fallen human heart to seek Him, when in our own self-centered rebellion we would never do so. Every good thing originates with God (James 1:17). Faith in God is a good thing, and so it also originates with God.

Even our best efforts fall far short of the righteousness required by God (Romans 3:23). That's why Scripture says that no one seeks God. We seek fulfillment. We seek pleasure. We seek escape from pain. But the pure motivation of seeking after God for Himself is a gift from God. We are not saved because we had the wisdom and insight to exercise our own faith and trust God. No one wakes up one day and, on his own, decides to seek God. That would be a salvation by our own works, and Scripture is clear we are saved only by the grace and mercy of God (Titus 3:5; Romans 11:6). We are saved when God touches our hearts and prompts us to use the faith He gives to receive His gift of salvation. Even with the knowledge of God's existence everywhere, people naturally choose to "suppress the truth by their wickedness" (Romans 1:18–20).

Because no one naturally seeks God, God seeks us. He sought Adam and Eve as they hid in the Garden (Genesis 3:9), and He has been seeking His lost loved ones ever since. Jesus gave this as His mission statement: "The Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost" (Luke 19:10).

When God saves us, we are <u>born again</u>. He opens our eyes to the truth; He gives us faith and forgiveness and fellowship with Him. We become new creations in Christ (<u>2 Corinthians</u> 5:17). In our newness of life, we are given godly desires (<u>Psalm 73:25</u>), a cleansed heart (<u>Hebrews 10:22</u>), and a new mind (<u>1 Corinthians 2:16</u>). In the power of the Holy Spirit, we begin to truly seek after God.

Explanation:

While Christianity is defined by Christ, it is described by His Church. Think about it... what serves as the greatest proof that Jesus rose from the dead... that Christ was raised on the third day and truly conquered the grave. 3. LOVE OUT

Illustration:

The church which is not a missionary church will be a missing church when Jesus comes.

Explanation:

Jesus explained what "Loving OUT" means AND how it validates His message and messengers. In short, the biblical and missional, Scriptural and self-less commitments to Christ's Great Commandments (Matthew 22:36-40) and Great Commission (Matthew 28:18-20) are definitively interwoven into the DNA of Christ's FAMILY. **If you don't Love OUT, you don't love Him!**

One need only to read 2 Corinthians 13:5 and its command to test ourselves, along with a regular revisiting of Revelation chapter 2 and 3's five shocking rebukes to churches that range from drifting away to already dead, to realize how important it is to have a healthy, biblical assessment of oneself and one's FAMILY.

Case in point, the closing of Christ's Sermon On The Mount (Matthew 5-7) is perhaps the most startling and stark warning in all the Bible. Why so? Simple. The two accounts referenced (first with professing and expectant "christians," followed by a man who built his proverbial "spiritual house" on the sand of self-reliance and biblical disobedience) draw into focus the eternal consequences (being cast into hell) that will come to all who have been found guilty of "spiritual identity theft."

Again, let us hear and heed the LORD Himself:

Matthew 28:18-20
